# Thought for the Week

Last week we celebrated the feast of one of the four patron saints of our islands – St David or Dewi Sant in Welsh.

Tradition has it that St David was born on a Pembrokeshire hill top during a storm, at a place now marked by the ruins of a small chapel. He went on to travel throughout Wales, preaching, teaching and founding monasteries and churches. His best-known miracle is said to have taken place when he was preaching in the middle of a large crowd at the Synod of Brefi, where the ground on which he stood rose up to form a small hill so that he could be better seen and heard. A white dove, which became his emblem, was seen settling on his shoulder.

David was beloved of his people for his saintly example, humility and holiness. He died on 1 March 589. His last words to his followers came from a sermon he gave on the previous Sunday: 'Be joyful, keep the faith, and do the little things that you have heard and seen me do.'

The phrase 'Gwnewch y pethau bychain' - 'Do the little things' - is still well-known in Wales.
