He is Risen! Risen Indeed!



Don't forget! The glorious Easter season continues until Trinity Sunday in June!

The **feast day of St George, Patron Saint of England** falls on Sunday, 23rd April this year, and so is liturgically celebrated on Monday 24th April.

St George was in all likelihood a Christian officer in the Roman army, of Syrian/ Palestinian heritage, and was martyred for his faith sometime before 290AD in one of the many persecutions of Diocletian. He was buried in Lydda, then Syrian Palestine, where a church dedicated to him was built over his tomb in the 4th century. The Anglo Saxon Chronicler St Bede mentions the name of St George in his writings.

His story captured the admiration of Crusaders in the Middle Ages, who brought his name back to England when they returned. Here, he became a model of chivalry and nobility, and was adopted as the patron saint of England in the 14th century.

St George is a major saint in the Orthodox Christian tradition and honoured as a prophetic figure in Islam too.

As well as being our patron saint, St George is also the patron of Malta, Gozo, Georgia, Portugal, Brazil. He is patron of various regions, states and cities: Rio di Janeiro, Aragon (Spain). Umbanda (Brazil), and Catalonia.

Thought for the Week

The Gospel of this Sunday is the famous account of the disciples of Emmaus.

The locality of Emmaus has not been identified with certainty. Various suggestions have been put forward, but not knowing for certain gives Emmaus a mysterious uniqueness, because it then represents every place: the road that leads there is the road every Christian, every person, takes.

The Risen Jesus makes himself our travelling companion as we go on our way, to kindle that warmth of faith and hope in our hearts, and to break the bread of eternal life.
