Thought for the Week

At a time when the seasons move into a steady point – Midsummer – we celebrate a saint who is unique among saints, in that he is the only one, apart from Our Lord and Our Lady, whose birthday we celebrate. He is St John the Baptist.

Both liturgically and seasonally, for many hundreds of years, this used to be a major feast accompanied by traditions and festivals. In our post-industrial world, we have lost many of the observances and customs associated with St John's Birthday, or transferred them to the summer solstice. Which is a pity, because in losing them, we also lose some of the significance of the feast, and how our ancestors understood it.

In England and Wales, celebrations included bonfires, feasting and dancing around the maypole. It is said that roses gathered on St John's Eve would bloom until Christmas. In Scandinavia, St John's Eve is still a national holiday!

An Anglo-Saxon poem, the *Menologium*, composed in the second half of the 10thC, catalogues the seasonal year and the saints' feasts associated with various key moments in the agricultural calendar. Of St John it says this:

'Then, after thirteen and ten nights [i.e. on 24th June] the thegn of glory, the Prince's darling, John, was born in days of old; we keep that feast at Midsummer, with great honour.' (*Translation by Dr Eleanor Parker, from 'A Clerk of Oxford' blog*).

St John was the herald of the Lord, and in himself the summary of all the prophets who had gone before him, and the first to point the way to Christ. As Jesus says in St Luke's gospel: 'What then did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft raiment? Behold, those who are gloriously apparelled live in kings' courts. What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is he of whom it is written, "Behold, I send my messenger before thy face who shall prepare thy way before thee"' (Luke 7:25-27)

St John the Baptist, we give thanks for your life, and your intercession. We thank God for all those who point us in the right direction, and pray that we too, might point others towards the right direction, who is Christ. Happy Feast Day!
