## Thought for the Day

Something unusual and wonderful is happening this weekend. Nothing less than the beatification of a whole family - a Polish Catholic family of nine - who were murdered in March 1944 for helping and hiding Jews. It will take place on Sunday 10 September in Markowa in Poland, where they lived.

Ahead of the beatification, Pope Francis has upheld the Ulma family's collective witness of faith in giving their lives to protect persecuted Jews during World War II.

"May the sacrifice made by the family of Józef and Wiktoria Ulma and their children, who did not hesitate to give their lives to help eight people of Jewish origin, be for us and future generations a symbol of faithfulness to values that must never be betrayed even under threat of death."

Despite the murder of the Ulmas—meant to strike fear into the hearts of villagers—their neighbours continued to hide Jewish fugitives until the end of World War II in Europe. At least 21 Polish Jews survived in Markowa during the occupation of Poland by Nazi Germany. They are regarded by the State of Israel as Righteous Among the Nations.

After their deaths, it was discovered that the family bible had the story of the Good Samaritan underlined in red. Josef and Wiktoria must have deeply felt the message of this story and were inspired by it to risk their lives to save their Jewish neighbours.

Cardinal Semeraro will celebrate the beatification Mass in Markowa on 10 September alongside 1,000 priests and 80 cardinals and bishops from Poland and abroad, with over 32,000 faithful registered to attend.

The Chief Rabbi of Poland will also be present at the Mass. The beatified family members are Jozef and Wiktoria Ulma and their children Stanisława, Barbara, Władysław, Franciszek, Antoni, Maria, and an unnamed child.
