THE MIGHTY ANTIPHONS OF ADVENT

This week we reach Gaudete Sunday = named after the opening line of the Introit of the day – 'Gaudete in Domino semper' 'Rejoice in the Lord always'. Indeed the Lord is near. Our 'O Antiphons' this week celebrate the Lord as 'O Oriens', 'Dayspring', one who brings the light, and 'Rex Gentium' 'King of the Nations', the desire of the peoples, and the Saviour.

This is the English translation of what you will hear:

O Dayspring, brightness of eternal light and sun of justice: come and illumine those sitting in darkness and the shadow of death.

O King of the Nations, and the desire thereof, the capstone who makes of two things one: come and save man whom you formed out of the mire!

PREPARING for ADVENT?

Have you thought about a spiritual preparation for Advent? Why not try reading each of the 24 chapters of St Luke's gospel, one for each day of Advent. It's a great way to get to know the Lord in time for the great feast of His birthday.
